

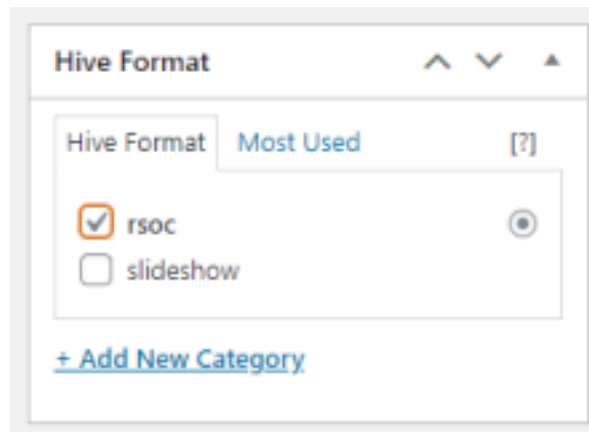

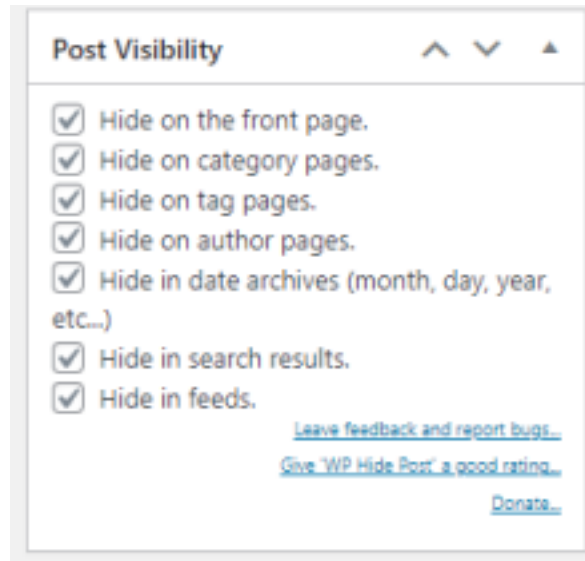
This document covers how to create a RSoC post in WP via the Admin panel

Required settings

When creating a new article in WP, the main requirement for it to be treated as an RSoC post is to set the **Hive Format** taxonomy to **rsoc** in the sidebar of the admin panel:

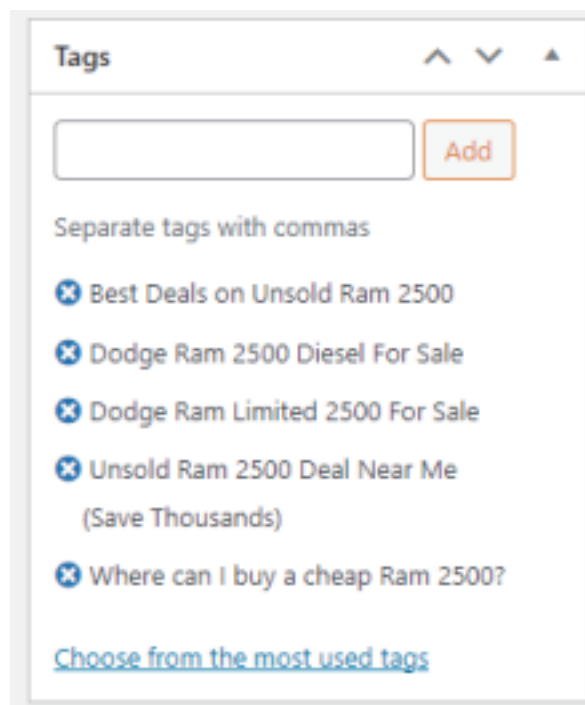


If the article should not be accessible via the homepage or search results, we want it to be hidden from all sources. This is managed in the **Post Visibility** section:



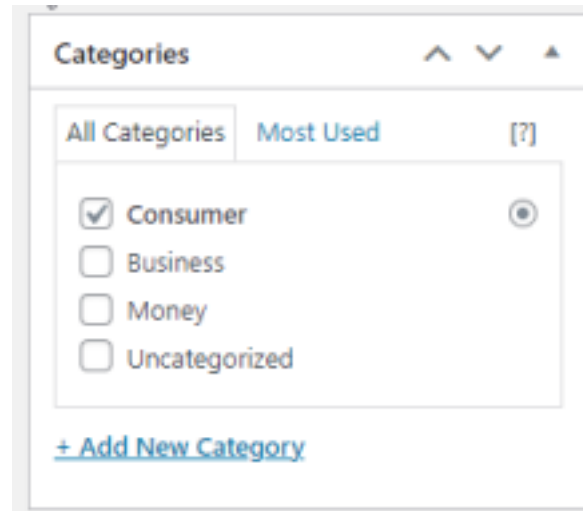
Optional Settings

The writer can control what terms are shown in the Related Search widget on the RSoC post. This is managed via the **Tags** section. NOTE: **If this section has under 3 terms, they will be ignored** since the AdSense widget requires at least three suggested terms to fill out the six Related Searches.

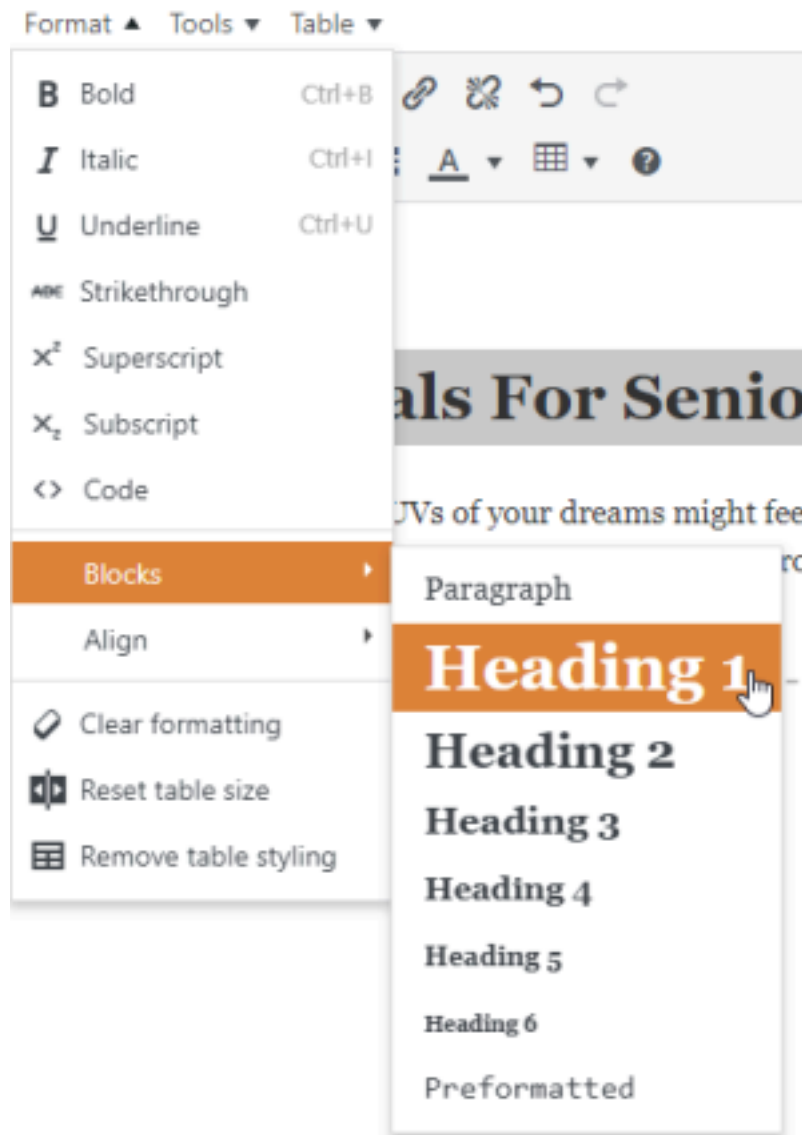
In order for the url to not show the **uncategorized** slug, the article needs to have a **Category** set:



Article Layout

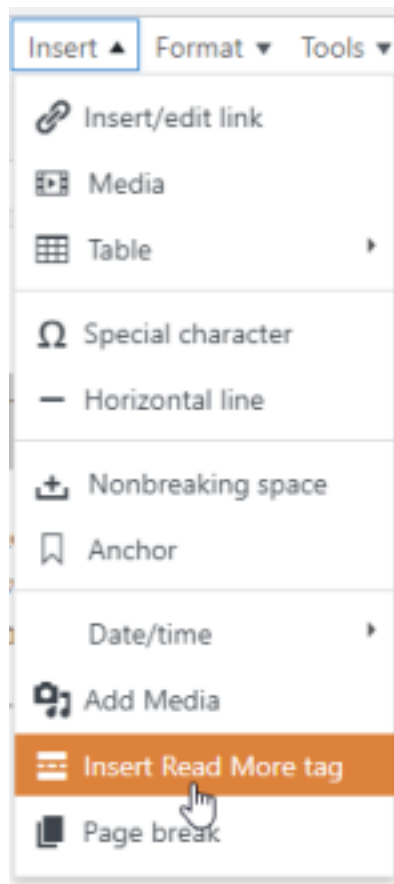
Majority of the content of RSoC posts are hidden behind a [Read More](#) link. If the writer does not specify where the Read More link should be, the system will attempt to guess where to add this which may not be ideal. The ideal RSoC layout will be as follows:

<h1> Heading 1 for the article </h1>



Intro paragraph

Read More tag



The remainder of the content. As long as the Read More tag is manually inserted above, the format of this content is flexible and up to the writer.
